Confession and Forgiveness

- P: Gracious and most merciful Father—
- C: In the light of your holiness I see myself as I really am.
- P: And I am guilty.
- C: I confess that I have impure thoughts and unclean lips.
- P: I think too highly of myself and too little of others.
- C: I cling too tightly to the treasures of this world.
- P: That I cannot open my hands to receive blessings from you.
- C: My feet walk in the path of sin.
- P: I wander astray and become a stranger to righteousness.
- C: Forgive me, and set me again on the path that leads to life.
- P: Deal with me not as I deserve, but according to your mercy.
- C: Not because I am worthy but because you are gracious. Lord, have mercy! Christ, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!

(Please silently reflect on the fact that though our sin is great, Christ's love is greater.)

P: Hear the good news! Jesus walked to places of rejection, suffering, torment and death—for you. Jesus was determined to go to Gethsemane, Gabbatha and Golgotha—for you. That's why Jesus forgives you completely and loves you eternally. Faithful Lord, with me abide!

C: I shall follow where you guide!

Old Testament Reading

Isaiah 53:8-12

- 8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away. And who can speak of his descendants? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was stricken.
- 9 He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.
- 10 Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the Lord makes his life a guilt offering, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in his hand.
- 11 After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.

James 2:8-13

- 10 or whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it.
- 11 For he who said, "Do not commit adultery," also said, "Do not murder." If you do not commit adultery but do commit murder, you have become a lawbreaker.
