

Old Testament Responsive Reading

Psalm 50:1-15

People: The Mighty One, God the Lord, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.

Women: Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth. Our God comes; He does not keep silence; before Him is a devouring fire, around Him a mighty tempest.

Men: He calls to the heavens above and to the earth, that He may judge His people: "Gather to Me My faithful ones, who made a covenant with Me by sacrifice!"

People: The heavens declare His righteousness, for God Himself is judge!

Women: "Hear, O My people, and I will speak; O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God. Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you; your burnt offerings are continually before Me.

Men: I will not accept a bull from your house or goats from your folds. For every beast of the forest is Mine, the cattle on a thousand hills. I know all the birds of the hills, and all that moves in the field is Mine.

Women: "If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and its fullness are Mine.

Epistle Reading: Hebrews 12:4–9 (An exhortation to faithful, peaceful living.)

- 4 In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood.
- 5 And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him.
- 6 For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."
- 7 It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline?
- 8 If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons.
- 9 Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live?

Luke 13:22–30 (Jesus shares insights into His kingdom that is to come.)

- 22 He went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying toward Jerusalem.
- 23 And someone said to him, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" And he said to them,
- 24 "Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able.

- 25 When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then he will answer you, 'I do not know where you come from.'
- 26 Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.'
- 27 But he will say, 'I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!'
- 28 In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God but you yourselves cast out.
- 29 And people will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God.
- 30 And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."


